Topics covered this term:

- Mathematics – Number and Measurement
You can help your child at home learn their basic addition and subtraction facts up to 20 and their times tables.
With Measurement the children will be carrying out practical measuring tasks using appropriate metric units for length, mass and capacity
- English – Your child should be reading at home. They will also have spelling words to learn each week. We will be having book week at the end of this term and hopefully, weather permitting; we will have a book character parade.
- Unit Studies – Life Made Easier. This is a science focus and we are looking at magnetism.
- Physical Education – Ball skills and Movement and dance.
- In Art the children will be drawing, painting and using a variety of construction materials to form their art work.
