## Tena koutou katoa Ellerslie whānau Fortnightly Special Greeting

Currently in New Zealand and around the world many Muslim people are observing Ramadan. A special greeting during this period is "Ramadan Kareem," which in Arabic translates into "Have a generous Ramadan," or "Ramadan Mubarak," which roughly translates into "Happy Ramadan." In 2024 Ramadan goes from March 12, 2024, and will end on April 9, 2024 with the Eid Al-Fitr celebration.

#### **Teaching and Learning - Parent Discussions**

#### Congratulations to...

Coulter Joyce (Year 7) for making it into the New Zealand BMXNZ Mighty 11BMX Test Team. This BMX team is made up of the top 4, 11 year old boys and top 4 girls in New Zealand. These riders compete against the best in 11 year olds Australia in what is known as the Trans-Tasman tests. The events are raced in Australia and New Zealand during the year. The first trip happens from April 6 to 16. While in Australia, the team will be travelling, training and racing together, staying together. The race event against the Australian team includes 2 rounds of the Australian National Series held near the end of the trip. This is an amazing achievement by Coulter and we wish him all the very best for his upcoming BMX test series against Australia.

It was fantastic to see all the Ellerslie students running and biking around the well known course. #### **Ministry of Education - Update**

As a number of you will be aware, the Minister of Education has launched a Ministerial Inquiry to address problems with the school property system where the scope of property works planned was unrealistic and unaffordable. They have now established a reference group of construction sector experts, principals, education peak body representatives and school board representatives to provide insights on the education sectors' views and experiences.

Ellerslie School has been affected by a number of unacceptable Ministry property decisions over the last number of years. As a reminder, we have not had a proper working hall / community indoor space for nearly 10 years. #### **AUCKLAND TRANSPORT INFORMATION**

Public transport fares are changing for under 25's from Wednesday 01 May. Fares for travel on AT buses, trains and ferries are changing for under 25 year olds from Wednesday 01 May 2024. Free travel for 5 to 12 year olds and half-price travel for 13 to 24 year olds on AT bus, train and ferry services will end on 30 April 2024, in line with the government's decision to withdraw funding for these concessions. This means that from Wednesday 1 May, 5 to 12 year olds will no longer travel for free on weekdays and will instead pay a child concession (at least 40% off adult fares). They will continue to travel for free on weekends. The child concession will apply to anyone aged 5 to 15, who has a registered AT HOP card with their correct date of birth. - When using the drop-off/pick-up zone outside the school, please note that this is a 2 minute area, and passengers should alight safely on the passenger's side of your vehicle.




























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
