Celebrating Achievement and Progress

At the beginning of this week, the Senior Leadership Team gave feedback to the Board on the school's 2023 end of achievement and progress data in Reading, Writing and Mathematics. This information shows where our students are achieving in relation to their curriculum level. While there is still work to do to ensure 85% of all students achieve within or beyond their expected curriculum, we are pleased at the overall progress students are making over 1 year. These results demonstrate the high quality of teaching and learning that is evident at our school as well as the implementation of a number of effective initiatives that are starting to deliver positive results. 




ELLERSLIE SCHOOL FOOTBALL 2024

CHICKEN POX

It appears that we have a few families who have been affected by chicken pox. Information from the Ministry of Health website is as follows:

"Chickenpox starts with a fever and/or general unwellness for a day or two followed by a rash. The rash starts out as small spots before changing to blisters with a red base. The rash usually starts on the head and face before spreading to the trunk and then the limbs. Chickenpox is spread by coughing and sneezing and also by direct contact with weeping blisters. It is highly infectious, from up to 2 days before the appearance of the rash until blisters have crusted (usually about 5-7 days)."

We therefore recommend that if you suspect your child has chicken pox, that they be kept home from school until they are no longer infectious. If you think your child has chicken pox or are in any way concerned, please see your family doctor.

TUMMY BUGS/COLDS

We have had a number of children unwell over the last couple of weeks with tummy bugs and colds. We ask that children who are unwell are kept at home - please consider other children and staff. Children should stay home for 24-48 hours after their last episode of vomiting and/or diarrhoea. Please see a medical professional if you are concerned about your child's health.
